What is Medicaid?

Medicaid is health coverage for Texans who need it most, primarily children, moms-to-be, grandparents and people with disabilities. It helps provide everything from routine checkups to heart surgeries. Medicaid pays healthcare providers for the services they provide to these vulnerable Texans.



Approximately 40% of children in Texas are enrolled in Medicaid.

Nearly **60%** of the days of care that children's hospitals in Texas provide are covered by Medicaid.

Texas Kids Depend on Medicaid.

Children's hospitals are uniquely equipped to handle the most complex medical conditions and depend heavily on Medicaid payments to continue providing comprehensive services.

56% of the patients transferred to a children's hospital were Medicaid patients.

Medicaid Recognizes the Complex Care Children's Hospitals Provide.

Texas Medicaid recognizes a limited number of freestanding, independent hospitals that provide complex health services to children as "children's hospitals." The children's hospital reimbursement rate is available to facilities that meet these high standards of care for children and have clinical and operational leadership and staff that are kid focused.

However, Medicaid Does Not Cover the Cost of Care.

Children's hospitals are heavily dependent on Medicaid payments, but Medicaid reimbursement does not fully cover the cost of care at children's hospitals.

Sufficient, predictable Medicaid reimbursement is vital to ensure that children in Texas do not lose access to comprehensive, life-saving care that often only freestanding children's hospitals can provide.

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
